LATE entries may be taken on the day, subject to space, between 09.00 – 09.45 am. No LATE entries will be accepted after 09.45 am to allow time for processing before Judging commences promptly at 10.00 am. The decision of the Exhibits Secretary is final.
- Please put your name, Membership number, if applicable, and contact details at the top of the page on your email. List the Class numbers in numerical order that you wish to enter. Remember: ONE exhibit per class per Exhibitor.

NOTES ON ENTRIES

- All exhibits for all classes must have been grown or produced by the entrant.
- Exhibits of vegetables must be divested of unnecessary leaves and stalks and be washed clean unless specified in the schedule.
- All pot plants must have been held by the exhibitor for at least 3 months •
A bowl – a hollow rounded cup-shaped container.
- A vase- a vessel of greater height than width
- Exhibitors are encouraged to name varieties, however errors in naming will not disqualify the entry.

The Fayre will be open to the public from 11.00 am, there will be informal workshops and demonstrations on a variety of topics. Refreshments and the 'On the Spot' Tombola will be available from 11.00 to 2.00 pm.
